The crime: Vegetables have been stolen from people's gardens.

Whoever has been doing the stealing is not just taking one or two cabbages but is stealing all the vegetables in the vegetable patch. They have been taking food from gardens all over the country, and don't seem to care about getting caught as they have been doing their stealing during the daytime.

An eye witness: Biz-zing Wisp says she saw an insect wearing a super hero costume taking peas, potatoes and beans from Mister John Jones' garden. Biz-zing tells me the insect called himself Wonder Weevil and said he is the Robin Hood of insects. I asked if she could identify him but Biz-zing said that because Wonder Weevil was in disguise, she didn't think she would be able to pick him out of a line up.

**To find the identity of Wonder Weevil
you will have to do some pretty
sneaky intelligence gathering**

As a Field Operative, you will have to find out:
How many different types of weevils are living on plants in your garden? To do this, you need a search warrant. You will find a search warrant - form 27B at the end of this case file.

When you have your warrant you can begin looking on the underside of leaves for small insects like these guys.



Biz-zing Wisp says Wonder Weevil is very small, about 7 mm from his nose to his tail.

Interrogation: You must read each weevil their rights as you catch them. Inspector Insector tells you how to do this on page 10 of “*The Capture of Criminal Insects*” handbook.



If you are a registered Field Operative, you can download the handbook from the Data base.



When you have caught a weevil, you must put them in a security

jar with food and water before you begin to ask your questions.

What to ask: To find out if the weevil you have in your jar is Wonder Weevil, you will have to ask where they were and what they were doing on January the fifth, when Biz-zing Wisp saw Wonder Weevil stealing food from Mister Jones' garden.

If they won't tell you, or you think they are not telling the truth, let them go but be sure to "*Tail*" them, watching from a safe distance to see if they steal any food.



Keep notes of all the things you see the weevil doing and ask yourself, is this what a Robin Hood food thief would do?

Keep watching until you are sure the weevil is - or is not Wonder Weevil.
